FALL IN WAMEGO- WHEN IS CLEAN UP DAY FOR YOU?



As leaves are falling, residents in Wamego look forward to cooler temperatures and fall festivities! Fall also means yard clean-up days! The City of Wamego will take one week in November to pick up your leaves and clippings, in paper bags, at the front curb. Tree limbs should be tied in 3' X 3' bundles in different sections of Wamego. See the schedule below to know when they'll be in your neighborhood.

Monday, November 17th - All areas East of Lincoln Ave.

Tuesday, November 18th - All areas West of Lincoln Ave, East of Walnut, and South of 8th.

Wednesday, November 19th - Areas West of Lincoln Ave and North of 8th.

Thursday, November 20th - All areas West of Walnut and South of 8th.

Friday, November 21st - Miscellaneous pick-ups

GET TO KNOW "FOG" THE ENEMY OF YOUR SEWER!

As the weather cools, it's important to remember how FOG—Fats, Oils, and Grease—affects our sewer system. FOG can come from everyday cooking items like butter, oil, lard, margarine, meat drippings, and shortening. When poured down the drain, these substances harden and coat pipes, leading to clogged sewer lines and even backups into homes or businesses.

Here's how you can help:

- Throw it away. Pour cooled grease into a can or mix oils with absorbent material (like kitty litter or coffee grounds) and place it in the trash.
- Wipe before you wash. Use a paper towel to clean out pans before rinsing.
- Keep drains clear. Pour ½
 cup of baking soda
 followed by ½ cup of
 vinegar down the drain.
 After 10-15 minutes, rinse
 with hot water.

While these tips are important year-round, cooler temperatures cause FOG to harden faster, making fall a great time to start good habits. Together, we can keep Wamego's sewer system running smoothly and prevent costly problems.



UPCOMING PROJECTS Airport Apron & Taxiway: Major upgrades are underway at the municipal airport, with a full reconstruction of the apron and taxiway. This project will AROUND TOWN A A A improve safety, durability, and long-term operations for pilots and visitors.

Kaw Valley Road: A complete rebuild of Kaw Valley Road will make travel smoother, safer, and more reliable for drivers, especially around the middle school.

TERS Project: This project will connect missing sidewalk links on 6th and 8th Streets. Pedestrian lights will be added to crossings on Kaw Valley Road, making it easier and safer for residents to walk or bike.

Safe Routes to School: Safer crossings are being built where kids and families need them most. Bulb-out sidewalks and pedestrian signals will shorten crosswalks and improve visibility on Lincoln at 7th and 8th, while the 6th & Ash intersection will be redesigned for safer travel.

Annual Street Work: Wamego continues to invest in its streets with annual milling, overlay, and concrete replacement projects. These improvements keep high-use roads in good condition, reduce long-term costs, and provide smoother travel for everyone.

Old City Shop Demolition: The long-awaited removal of the old City Shop will open up space for a new parking lot serving the Aquatic Center and downtown. The project will also include alley improvements, helping traffic flow more smoothly in the area.

CCLIP Projects: Two major street improvements are on the horizon: reconstruction of the HWY 99 entrance into Wamego from the bridge to Valley to enhance safety, and a mill-and-overlay from 8th street to HWY 24 to extend the life of this key corridor.
