- Fix or remove any structure that could be unsafe

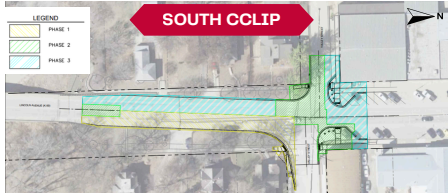
SPRING HAS SPRUNG!

PROJECT UPDATES

Phase 1 of the South CCLIP Project is officially underway through a partnership between the City of Wamego and KDOT. This work focuses on improvements to the south entrance of town, from the bridge north to Valley Street. During this phase, right turns onto Valley Street are temporarily restricted, truck traffic is routed through Lincoln Avenue, and pedestrians in the area should use extra caution due to increased traffic.



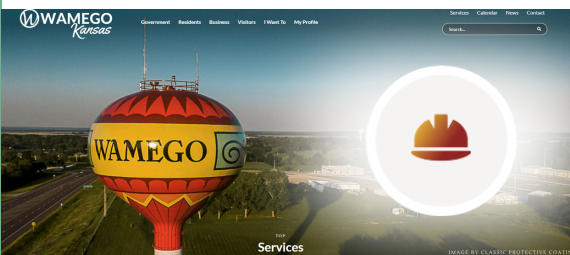
If your project requires **excavation**, mark your dig site, then call 1-800-DIG SAFE or simply 811, to ensure that all owners of underground utilities have a chance to mark their utility lines at the site. This service is free of charge.

These upgrades will improve traffic flow and create a safer, more efficient truck route once fully accessible and enforced again. Our goal is to have the project completed by the Fourth of July, or at minimum, have the roadway open for holiday travel. Access in and out of town via the bridge will remain available throughout construction.
