UTV REQUIREMENTS



Operators must possess a valid driver's license and have liability insurance coverage for their vehicles. The annual registration fee is \$25 regardless of the time of year the application is made.

NOTABLE SUMMER REGULATIONS

Please keep in mind that in Wamego the maximum allowable height is 6" for grass and 12" for weeds. Property owners are responsible for mowing out to the adjoining street. Also, blowing grass into streets is prohibited. This reduces the debris in streets and keeps grass clippings from clogging our storm drainage system. Thanks for your efforts to great make Wamego look throughout this growing season!

The City has a limb, brush, and grassclippings (NO BAGS) dump site east on Valley Street and south of the wastewater treatment plant for your convenience. All other materials must be hauled to the county landfill, junkyard, or be picked up by your trash hauler.

STREET PROJECT

This street project will include Walnut, Spruce, Chestnut, and Vine Street from 4th to 8th Street and all the side streets in between! The project has been split into 8 phases. Phase 1, Vine from 4th to 6th, is scheduled to begin in August 2023!

This project will include replacing all streets, curbs, storm drains, sidewalks, waterlines, and sewer lines.

MEMORIAL DAY FLOWERS

THIS MEMORIAL DAY, MAY 29, THE WAMEGO CITY CEMETERY WILL BE DECKED OUT WITH FLAGS AND FLOWERS. SEASONAL FLOWERS, CUT FLOWERS, ARTIFICIAL PLANTS OR FLOWERS, AND WREATHS ARE PERMITTED OVER THE ENTIRE GRAVE SPACE FROM MAY 25TH THROUGH JUNE 2ND. AFTER THIS TIME FRAME ANYTHING OUTSIDE OF THE NORMAL CEMETERY REGULATIONS WILL BE REMOVED AND DISCARDED.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING NEEDS INSPECTED!

IF YOU OWN AN ELECTRIC VEHICLE. REMEMBER THAT A DEDICATED CIRCUIT FOR YOUR CHARGING OUTLET IS A MUST! WHEN EV CHARGING STATIONS ARE INCORRECTLY INSTALLED, THE RISK OF **EXPLOSION OR FIRE IS** GREATLY INCREASED FOR LITHIUM-ION BATTERIES. CITY INSPECTION IS **REQUIRED TO ENSURE** THAT YOU HAVE A SAFE CHARGING STATION IN PLACE. It's time to get the backyard swimming pool up and running. Whether your pool is the permanent in-ground type, above-ground pool, or even an inflatable rubber pool, safety is an important consideration. Remember that if the water depth exceeds 24" several rules kick in. First, there must be a barrier (usually a chain link fence or privacy fence) that surrounds the pool, with no gap in the barrier that would permit a 4" ball to pass through. Gates must be self- closing and self latching and must open away from the pool. If access to the pool is directly from the house, the door must be equipped with an alarm that will sound when opened. The point is to prevent a young unattended child from ever gaining access to the pool. Other rules and exceptions apply in some cases. If you are planning to install a pool, you must secure a permit and inspection from the City.
